There are over 30 groups in Australia with over 1200 members who paddle at least once a week, if not more. 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As we entered this financial year, excitement was building because 2018 was the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of DAA. It is quite an achievement for any business, never mind a charity, that relies solely on donations to exist. We are proud to say that many members who were with us in the beginning are still paddlers or members today. This achievement is only made possible through the commitment of member groups around Australia with the assistance of the Board and national office in Brisbane. DAA brings a national group of volunteers together who continue the mission to help breast cancer survivors improve their health.

#### **Dragons Abreast Festival – October 2017**

The 10th Annual Dragons Abreast Festival at Darling Harbour in Sydney was again a success. Under the capable management of Angie O'Reilly and her committed group of volunteers, this corporate/social event is our only major fundraiser. Funds raised at this event allow DAA to do more for existing groups and to help with the start-up of new groups. Some highlights of the event are watching paddlers who have never been in a dragon boat win a race (very exciting), the Chinese Youth League Lion Dancers and of course the Flowers on the Water ceremony where we take time to remember those who sadly have joined our Angels Abreast team. They are never forgotten.

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#### **Ord River Challenge**

While DAA encourages participation first, competition does happen. Our members love a challenge, particularly a personal one. With that being said, the Board of DAA has organized an exclusive DAA Ord River Challenge which will happen in June 2019. Early planning is important for success and is already a sold out event for DAA paid members. Paddling the Ord is a 'bucket list' item for many members and this involves a 55km paddle down the mighty Ord River from Lake Argyle to Kununurra. Plenty of good times will be had with amazing scenery along the way.

#### **IBCPC Dragon Boat Festival – Florence, Italy**

Over the past couple of years, great excitement has been building in member groups as the International Breast Cancer Paddler's Commission event approached. The Festival is only held every four years and this time it was in Florence, Italy! This is an international, non-competitive participatory event.

The two-day paddling event took place in early July but planning has been under way for a couple of years. Groups were able to fundraise to offset some of their costs such as registration fees. Not all groups were able to send a full team so DAA organized three composite boats and coordinated all payments including payment for exclusive T-shirts designed by our own Linda Papworth. This enabled more of our members to participate.

Approximately 500 DAA survivors and supporters travelled to Italy. The training that had taken place certainly paid off and DAA groups were competitive as ever, even winning a few races. In addition to the paddling, it was an amazing experience to explore Florence and meet new friends from around the globe.
